THE RANKINGS EXPLAINED

There are two ways of ranking PCT world class commissioning scores. This table ranks PCTs first by their governance scores (awarding two points for each green, one point for each amber and no points for each red) and then by their total competency scores. An alternative methodology weights the governance and competency components of the assessment equally and results in some PCTs moving places. See hsj.co.uk/wcc to view that ranking and more.
